COLLEGE OF LETTERS AND SCIENCE BREADTH REQUIREMENTS

*****IMPORTANT*****

Primarily, these are the breadth requirements for the College of Letters & Science only. Applicants to majors offered by the College of Chemistry, College of Engineering, College of Environmental Design, College of Natural Resources and HAAS School of Business should check the individual agreements for any exceptions and breadth requirement guidelines.

Requirements for the College of Letters and Science are divided into four areas:

- 1) Reading and Composition (R&C);
- 2) Quantitative Reasoning (QR);
- 3) Foreign Language (FL); and
- 4) The Seven-Course Breadth Requirement.

- R&C, QR, and FL **must be satisfied by the end of the spring term that precedes your first semester at UC Berkeley.**

- The Seven-Course Breadth Requirement must be completed before graduation from Berkeley.

- **NOTE:** completion of IGETC (certified by your community college) satisfies all of these requirements. See majors in other colleges for their breadth requirements.

To satisfy the Reading and Composition (R&C), Quantitative Reasoning (QR), and Foreign Language (FL) Requirements, students must earn a letter grade of C- or better in all courses.

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General Education/Breadth (continued)

READING AND COMPOSITION (R&C):

Complete courses articulated for the Reading and Composition Requirement at Berkeley.

You may also satisfy this requirement with a score/grade of:
5 on the AP Exam in English Literature & Composition;
5 on the IB Higher Level Exam in English Language A1 credential exam;
C or better on the A-Level English Exam.

You may satisfy the **first half** of this requirement with a score of 4 on the AP Exam in English Literature & Composition, or a score of 4 or 5 on the AP Exam in English Language & Composition.

Courses that satisfy R&C requirement: | ENGL 1A + 1B = UCB R1A
| ENGL 1B + 1C = UCB R1B
| ENGL 1A + 1B + 1C = UCB R1A + R1B

QUANTITATIVE REASONING (QR):

Complete courses articulated for the Quantitative Reasoning Requirement at Berkeley.

You may also satisfy this requirement with a score/grade of:
600 on the SAT Reasoning Test;
520 on the Level II Exam, if taken May 1995 or later;
570 on the Level I Exam, if taken between 1995 and Spring 2005
28 on the ACT;
3 or better on the AP Exam in Calculus AB or BC;
3 or better on the AP Exam in Computer Science;
3 or better on the AP Exam in Statistics;
5 or better on the IB Higher Level Math or Computer Science Exam;
C or better on the A-Level Math Exam.

Courses that satisfy QR requirement: | CBIS 5 FORTRAN Programming (3)

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General Education/Breadth (continued)

FOREIGN LANGUAGE (FL):

Complete courses articulated for the Foreign Language Requirement at Berkeley.

You may also satisfy this requirement with:

A course comparable to the third year of a foreign language in high school or the second semester of a foreign language as taught at Berkeley.

A score/grade of:

550 on the SAT II Foreign Language Subject Exam, if taken before May 1995;

590 on the SAT II Subject Exam, if taken May 1995 or later;

3 or better on the Foreign Language AP Exam;

C or better on the A-Level or GCSE/O-Level Foreign Language Exam.

Courses that satisfy FL requirement: | SPAN 2A Intermediate Spanish (4)

===== SEVEN-COURSE BREADTH =====

Guidelines:

- Requirements must be met with courses -- no AP, IB or A level Exam credit;
- Courses may be taken for a grade (C- or better), P/NP, or CR/NC (if P or CR means C- or better);
- Courses must carry a minimum of 2 semester (3 quarter) units;
- Courses from your major department may be used (**does not apply to Haas applicants**);
- Not more than 2 courses offered by the same department may be used;
- Courses used for breadth credit may not also be used to meet the Reading and Composition, Quantitative Reasoning, or Foreign Language requirements.

****** Take one course from each of the following seven areas ******

ARTS AND LITERATURE: Courses that involve significant engagement with arts, literature, or language (excluding language instruction or the acquisition of technical skills), either through practical engagement with works of art or through the creation of art.

Courses that satisfy the **Arts and Literature** Seven-Course Breadth Requirement: | NO COURSE ARTICULATED
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BIOLOGICAL SCIENCE: Courses in the biological sciences, with some cross-listings, as well as a selection of courses from related disciplines such as anthropology, nutritional sciences, and psychology.

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General Education/Breadth (continued)

Courses that satisfy the **Biological Science** Seven-Course Breadth Requirement: | NO COURSE ARTICULATED
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HISTORICAL STUDIES: Most courses in the department of History, and other courses that deal primarily with the human events, institutions, and activities of the past.

Courses that satisfy the **Historical Studies** Seven-Course Breadth requirement: | NO COURSE ARTICULATED
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INTERNATIONAL STUDIES: Courses that involve the study of the contemporary politics, culture, arts, intermediate language, or socioeconomic structure of at least one country other than the U.S., or courses that involve comparison between the U.S. and another country (subcultures within the U.S. do not qualify as subjects of study for the purposes of this requirement).

Courses that satisfy the **International Studies** Seven-Course Breadth Requirement: | NO COURSE ARTICULATED
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PHILOSOPHY AND VALUES: Most courses in the department of Philosophy, plus courses with a major focus on religion, ethics, legal values, or leading philosophical figures.

Courses that satisfy the **Philosophy and Values** Seven-Course Breadth Requirement: | NO COURSE ARTICULATED
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PHYSICAL SCIENCE: Courses in the physical sciences such as astronomy, chemistry, geology, geophysics, and physics, as well as a selection of courses from related disciplines with some cross-listing. Courses that focus only on computer skills do not qualify.

Courses that satisfy the **Physical Sciences** Seven-Course Breadth Requirement: | NO COURSE ARTICULATED
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SOCIAL AND BEHAVIORAL SCIENCES: Many courses in the departments of Economics, Legal Studies, Political Science, Sociology, Social Welfare, and many courses in anthropology, geography, and psychology. A variety of courses from other disciplines and some advanced language courses with a significant linguistic component are also acceptable.

Courses that satisfy the **Social and Behavioral Sciences** Seven-Course Breadth Requirement: | NO COURSE ARTICULATED
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END OF AGREEMENT
