#### Abstract

To transfer to the Graziadio School of Business and Management's Bachelor of Science in Management program, a student must have earned an acceptable grade point average on 68 or more transferable semester units from a regionally accredited college or university. Students should be employed on a full-time basis or have significant prior work experience in order to relate to the other students and the material covered in the course. Final decision of transferable courses will be made by admission representatives at the Graziadio School of Business and Management, Pepperdine University.

## AREA 7: ELECTIVES

An additional 23-35 semester units of course work from Areas 1 to 6 above PLUS AA/AS major preparation courses. Other courses not listed above that are applicable to the AA degree may be reviewed for applicability as electives. Students are encouraged to take courses from the following areas to enhance their preparation for the Graziadio School's BSM program: ACCOUNTING; BANKING AND FINANCE; BUSINESS; BUSINESS INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY; COMPUTER INFORMATION SYSTEMS; HOSPITALITY; and MARKETING.

In addition, the following courses have been articulated so as to provide an option for students to WAIVE UP TO 12 UNITS OF BSM COURSE WORK, thus reducing the residential units to be taken at Pepperdine to 48 units. A minimum of four additional elective units are required for each four-unit courses waived.

to waive ACCT 472 Accounting
$\square \quad$ Grade B or better in BUS 14A and either STAT 15 or STAT 18
to waive DESC 471 Statistical Methods for Business
$\square \quad$ Grade B or better in ECON 1A and ECON 1B
to waive ECNM 469 Managerial Economics
$\square \quad$ Grade B or better in CIS 10 and either CIS 50 or CIS 55
to waive ISTM 476 Information Systems for Business and Management
$\square \quad$ Grade B or better in BUS 12A and BUS 12B
to waive LEGL 470 Legal Environment of Business

Note that students who waive any of the above courses in the BSM program, and who subsequently enroll in the MBAJ program will be required to complete the equivalent MBA core course.
